
Connect the scanner to the computer and the power supply. The scanner can be connected to a USB port or LAN port on the computer.






# **Power Supply Connection**

- Connect the supplied power cord into the power connector on the back of the scanner. (1)
- Connect the power cord into an AC outlet. (2)





# **Connecting to a Computer**

The scanner supports either USB connection or wired LAN connection. The scanner automatically recognizes the connection method when the USB cable or the LAN cable is connected.

# IMPORTANT

- This connection method remains effective until the power to the scanner is turned off. To change the connection method, disconnect the cable, restart the scanner, and connect the other cable.
- When the scanner starts up, if both the USB cable and the LAN cable are connected, the USB connection takes precedence.


# **Connecting via USB**

Use the included USB cable to connect to the computer.

# **IMPORTANT**

Do not connect the scanner to the computer before installing the software.

The end of the USB cable with the square plug (Type B) connects to the scanner. The other end with the flat plug (Type A) connects to a USB port on the computer.



# **Connecting via wired LAN**

Use a LAN cable to connect the scanner to a wired LAN router.


# IMPORTANT

- The computer needs to be connected to the router via wired or wireless LAN.
- The router and LAN cable are not included, and must be provided separately.

# | Hint

- The scanner supports DHCP (Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol). A DHCP server in the network environment provides IP addresses that can be automatically acquired, eliminating the need to specify an IP address for the scanner.
- If you must specify a fixed IP address for the scanner, such as when using it on a network without a DHCP server, you can specify a static IP address on the operation panel or from the Web Menu.

- When connecting via wired LAN, the optional flatbed scanner cannot be used.




# STEP 5

# **Turning the Power ON**

The power of the scanner can be turned ON and OFF with the power switch on the front of the scanner.

- Make sure that the scanner and computer are connected properly.
- 2 Press the power switch.



The power button lights green when the power turns ON.

# 일 Hint

 When connected with the USB cable, the following message balloon appears on the task bar when the scanner's power switch is turned on the first time. If you wait a while, automatic scanner recognition will end and the scanner will become ready to use.



When the scanner is properly connected to the computer, the 

 (CaptureOnTouch) icon appears on the taskbar as follows.



If the taskbar icon appears as , the scanner is not properly connected to the computer. Check the status of the power switch and the USB or LAN cable.

# **Turning Off the Power**

Press and hold the power switch to turn it off.

# **IMPORTANT**

- After turning the scanner off, wait at least 10 seconds before turning it back on.
- If you will not be using the scanner for an extended period, you should disconnect the power cord from the AC outlet for safety.

# **Hint**

The scanner's auto power off setting is enabled by default, and the scanner will turn off automatically if it is not operated for 4 hours. To override this setting, please see "About the Canon imageFORMULA Driver Setting Tool" on p. 96.



# **Before Using the Scanner**


# **Important Safety Instructions**

To ensure the safe operation of this scanner, be sure to read the safety warnings and precautions described below.

## **Installation Location**

The performance of this scanner is affected by the environment in which it is installed. Make sure that the location where the scanner is installed meets the following environmental requirements.

 Provide adequate space around the scanner for operation, maintenance, and ventilation.




- Avoid installing the machine in direct sunlight. If this is unavoidable, use curtains to shade the scanner.
- Avoid locations where a considerable amount of dust accumulates as dust may adversely affect the inside of the scanner. Avoid warm or humid locations, such as in the vicinity of a water faucet, water heater, or humidifier.
- Avoid locations where ammonia gas is emitted. Avoid locations near volatile or flammable materials, such as alcohol or paint thinner.
- Avoid locations that are subject to vibration.
- Avoid exposing the scanner to rapid changes in temperature. If the room in which the scanner is installed is cold but rapidly heated, water droplets (condensation) may form inside the scanner. This may result in a noticeable degradation in scanning quality. The following conditions are recommended for optimal scanning quality: Room temperature: 10 °C to 35 °C (50 °F to 95 °F) Humidity: 20% to 80% RH
- Avoid installing the scanner near equipment that generates a magnetic field (e.g. speakers, televisions, or radios.)

# **Power Supply**

- Connect only to a power outlet of the rated voltage and power supply frequency (120 V, 60 Hz or 220-240 V, 50/60 Hz depending on your region).
- Do not use the scanner with a power supply that is not rated for the specified voltage. Doing so might cause a fire or electric shock.
- Do not connect other electrical equipment to the same power outlet to which the scanner is connected. Also, when using an extension cord, make sure that the extension cord is rated for the current requirements of the scanner.
- The power cord may be damaged if frequently stepped on or if heavy objects are placed on it.
- Do not use the power cord while it is coiled.
- Do not pull directly on the power cord. When disconnecting the power cord, grasp the plug and remove it from the outlet.
- Keep the area around the power cord clear of objects so that the power cord can be disconnected easily in an emergency.
- If you have any questions regarding the power supply, contact your local authorized Canon dealer or service representative for further information.

# **Moving the Scanner**

• The scanner weights about 25.0 kg (55.1 lbs). To lift or move the scanner, always use two people, one on each side. Never attempt to lift the scanner by yourself. You could drop the scanner or pinch your fingers, resulting in personal injury or damage to the scanner. Remember to be extra careful when moving it.



 Make sure to disconnect the interface cable and power cord when moving the scanner. If the scanner is carried with these items connected, the plugs and connectors may be damaged or cause the scanner to fall and result in personal injury or damage to the scanner.

# **Handling**



### WARNING

Note the following precautions whenever using the scanner. Failure to do so may result in a fire or electric shock.

- Never use alcohol, benzene, paint thinner, aerosol sprays, or any other highly flammable substance near the scanner.
- Do not cut, damage, or modify the power cord. Do not place heavy objects on the power cord, and do not pull or excessively bend the power cord.

- Never connect the power cord when your hands are wet.
- Do not connect the scanner to a multi plug power strip.
- Do not knot or coil the power cord as this may result in a fire or electric shock. When connecting the power cord, make sure that the power plug is securely and completely inserted into the power outlet.
- To use a reel-type extension cord, unwind all of the cord from the reel. Long-term operation with the cord wound on the reel may cause the cord to overheat and could cause a fire.
- Do not use power cords other than the power cord supplied with this scanner.
- Never try to take the scanner apart or modify it in any way, as this
  is dangerous and may lead to a fire or electric shock.
- Do not use flammable spray near the scanner.
- When cleaning the scanner, turn the power switch OFF and disconnect the power plug from the power supply.
- Clean the scanner using a slightly dampened cloth which has been well wrung out. Never use alcohol, benzene, paint thinner, or any other flammable substances.
- If an abnormal sound, smoke, heating, or an unusual odor occurs, or when an abnormality is discovered such as the scanner not working after turning the power OFF and back ON, immediately turn off the power switch and unplug the power plug from the outlet. Then, contact your local authorized Canon dealer or service representative to have the unit serviced.
- Do not drop the scanner, or subject it to impact or strong shock. Should the scanner ever become damaged, immediately turn the power switch OFF, and disconnect the power plug from the power outlet. Then, contact your local authorized Canon dealer or service representative to have the unit serviced.

 Before moving the scanner, make sure to turn the power switch OFF, and disconnect the power plug from the power outlet.



#### CAUTION

- Do not install the scanner on a surface that is unstable or tilted, or in an area subject to excessive vibrations, as this may cause the scanner to fall, resulting in personal injury or damage to the scanner.
- Do not block the ventilation holes. Doing so could cause the scanner to overheat, creating a fire hazard.
- Never place small metal objects such as staples, paper clips, or jewelry on the scanner. These items may fall into the scanner, and cause a fire or electric shock. Should such objects ever fall inside the scanner, immediately turn the power switch OFF, and disconnect the power plug from the power outlet. Then, contact your local authorized Canon dealer or service representative to have the unit serviced.
- Do not install the scanner in a humid or dusty location. Doing so might cause a fire or electric shock.
- Do not place objects on top of the scanner. Such objects may tip or fall over, resulting in personal injury.
- When unplugging the power cord, grasp it firmly by its plug. Do not pull directly on the power cord, as this may damage or expose the cord's internal wiring, resulting in a fire or electric shock.
- Leave sufficient space around the power plug so that it can be unplugged easily. If objects are placed around the power plug, you will be unable to unplug it in an emergency.
- Do not allow water or flammable substances (alcohol, paint thinner, benzene, etc.) to spill into the scanner, as this may result in a fire or electric shock. Doing so might cause a fire or electric shock.

- For safety when the scanner will not be used for a long time, be sure to unplug the power cord from the scanner and unplug the power plug from the wall outlet.
- Do not wear loose clothing or jewelry that may get caught in the scanner while you are using it, as this may result in personal injury. Be extra careful of neckties and long hair. If anything becomes caught in the scanner, immediately disconnect the power cord to stop the scanner.
- Be careful when loading paper into the scanner and when removing jammed paper, as it is possible to cut your hand on the edge of a sheet of paper.



### CAUTION: Hot Surface

 The part where the seal is attached can become hot, and handling it carelessly can result in burns. To ensure safe handling, be sure to observe all safety precautions.

# **Disposal**

When disposing of the scanner, be sure to follow all local ordinances and laws, or consult with your local authorized Canon dealer or service representative.

# **Features of the Scanner**

The main features of the scanner are described below.

#### **Scanner Features**

#### Variety of Scanning Modes

The scanner is equipped with the following scanning modes. Black and White, Error Diffusion, Advanced Text Enhancement, Advanced Text Enhancement II, Active Threshold, 256-level Grayscale, and 24-bit Color

\* Advanced Text Enhancement and Active Threshold can clarify scanned text by processing background or foreground colors.

#### Fast Document Feeding

The scanner can scan up to 140 document sheets per minute of LTR/A4-size paper in black and white, grayscale, and color scanning modes (for the DR-G2140).

\* Scanning conditions: LTR/A4 landscape, duplex, 300 dpi

#### Large Capacity Feeder

Up to 500 plain paper document sheets (up to 300 in the DR-G2090) can be loaded in the Document Feed Tray.

#### Count-Only Mode

When operating the scanner as a stand-alone device, this mode counts the number of loaded document sheets. "Count-Only Mode" (See p. 56)

### Adjustable Document Feed Tray

The position of the Document Feed Tray can be adjusted according to the number of document sheets to be loaded. "Preparing the Document Feed Tray" (See p. 36)

#### Long Document Mode

Depending on User Mode settings, it is possible to scan documents up to 5,588 mm long (220") (or up to 3,000 mm (118.11") with the DR-G2090). Also, the feeding speed can be changed in Long Document Mode. "Long Document Scanning" (See p. 50)

#### • Freely Adjustable Document Guides

The left and right document guides can be adjusted for either leftor right-side scanning. "Adjusting the Document Guides" (See p. 39)

#### User Mode

User Mode functions can be employed to set the scanner for practically any condition. "User Mode Operations" (See p. 60)

### **Detection Functions**

#### Auto Color Detection

Automatically detects whether scanned documents are color, grayscale, or black and white.

#### Paper Size Detection

Detects the document page size before scanning.



Fixed-size scan Auto-size-detection scan

#### Skew Detection

The scanner stops feeding when a skewed document is detected as it touches the edges of the feeder inlet.

#### Staple Detection

The scanner stops feeding when it detects the presence of stapled documents. "Staple Detection" (See p. 67)

#### Dust Detection

Detects dust in the scanning unit and performs error processing as needed. "Dust Detection" (See p. 68)

#### Ultrasonic Double Feed Detection

The scanner stops feeding when the ultrasonic sensor detects that two or more document pages are feeding at the same time. "Double Feed" (See p. 66)

\* A non-detection area can be specified to avoid double-feed detection in areas such as those containing adhesive labels.

#### Double feed detection by length

The scanner stops feeding when a double feed is detected by comparing document page lengths. "Double Feed" (See p. 66)

\* Based on the length of the first document page, the scanner detects a double feed when fed a different-length page.

#### Prescan


At the start of scanning, this function prescans the first page and pauses so that you can adjust brightness and contrast before resuming scanning.

#### Verify Scan

While scanning, the scanned page count is verified against a prespecified count or that obtained from Count-Only Mode. "Verify Scan" (See p. 56)

#### Text Orientation Detection

The text orientation on each page is detected, and the scanned image is rotated in 90-degree increments as necessary for normalization.



### **Image Processing**

#### Prevent Bleed Through/Remove Background

Prevents the background or original image on the reverse side of thin originals from appearing in scanned images.

#### Color Unevenness Reduction Function

You can control or reduce the color irregularity at the time of the scan.

#### Document orientation

The text orientation on each fed page is detected, and the scanned image is rotated in 90-degree increments as necessary to match.


#### Deskew

If a scanned image is detected to be skewed, the skewed image is straightened.



#### Drop-Out and Color Enhancement


The scanner is equipped with color drop-out and enhancement functions that enable you to specify one color (red, blue, or green) or intermediate color range to be omitted (dropped out) or enhanced when scanning.


### Binding Hole Removal

Erases shadows that appear on scanned images from binding holes on the document.



#### Folio Scan

Documents that are too large to fit in the feeder inlet can be folded and scanned on both sides, with the images then combined into a single image. "Scanning Documents Larger than A3" (See p. 47)



#### MultiStream

With applications that support the scanner's MultiStream capability, three images with different scanning conditions are created from a single scan pass. However, this function is only available when using software that supports MultiStream.

#### Thickening Text and Lines

If text and lines in scanned images are very thin, this function corrects for their thickness while scanning.

#### Background smoothing

#### Barcode Detection

Barcodes on documents can be detected and decoded by installing the barcode module.

#### Patchcode Detection

Patchcode sheets can be inserted in the document stack to perform batch separation. "More Advanced Scanning Methods (Batch Separation)" (See p. 92)

## Other requirements

#### Rapid Recovery System

When this function is activated and a sensor detects a misfeed, such as from a paper jam or double feed, scanning pauses to allow you to correct the cause before continuing from the document page on which the abnormality was detected. "Detecting a Document Double Feed" (See p. 53)

\* The Rapid Recovery System is effective when feeding stops as a result of detection of a Paper Jam, Double Feed, Skew, or Staple.

#### A4 Carrier sheet

Use the separately sold carrier sheet (A4), you can scan without damaging the original.

### Feed Interval Setting

You can set the document feed interval. Lengthening the paper feed interval can make it easier to keep ejected documents aligned.



# **Documents**

This scanner can scan documents ranging in size from business cards and checks up to A3 size, and documents of the following sizes and paper thicknesses can be used depending on the paper feed method.

- Setting the scanner to Long Document Mode enables scanning documents up to 5,588 mm (220") long. "Long Document Scanning" (See p. 50)

### **Hint**

Continuous feeding feeds document pages from the Document Feed Tray one by one by the feed and retard rollers until the batch of documents has been scanned



### IMPORTANT

The documents to be scanned must satisfy certain criteria. Read the following items carefully.

- Scanning documents that are different sizes, thicknesses, or textures together could result in a paper jam unless the leading edges of the documents in the stack are all aligned.
- Scanning documents before the ink is dry can cause problems with the scanner. Always make sure that the ink on a document is dry before scanning it.
- Scanning documents that are written in pencil or similar material may make the rollers and scanning glass dirty, which can lead to smudges on the scanned image and transfer the dirt to subsequent documents. Always clean the internal parts of the scanner after scanning such documents.
- When scanning a two-sided document that is printed on thin paper, the image on the opposite side of each page may show through. In that case, adjust the scanning brightness from the application program, or enable the [Prevent Bleed Through/Remove Background] setting before scanning.

 Scanning the following types of documents can cause a paper jam or malfunction. To scan such a document, make a photocopy of the document and then scan the photocopy.



There are creases or fold lines.



Carbon paper.



There are curls.



The surface is coated.



There are tears.



Extremely thin document such as semi-transparent thin paper.



There are clips or staples.



Documents with excessive paper dust particles.

- To scan bound multi-page documents such as invoice booklets, place the bound edge against the feeder inlet and scan by manual feeding.
- To use the Long Document Mode, feed document pages manually, one after another.
- In Folio document mode, fold sheets and feed them manually, one side at a time.






# **Preparing the Document Eject Tray**

The Document Eject Tray includes two Document Eject Guides, the Eject Tray Extension and Eject Paper Stopper, to be adjusted to fit the width and length of your documents.

#### **Document Guides**

Slide the Document Eject Guides to fit the width of your documents. The eject position of the document can be checked by feeding a single document sheet in Count-Only Mode. "Count-Only Mode" (See p. 56)




## **Document Eject Tray Extension**

Open the Document Eject Tray Extension when documents may eject beyond the Document Eject Tray.



**Document Eject Stopper** 

Raise the Document Eject Stopper to stop ejected documents from spilling out of the Document Eject Tray.



Hint

The Document Eject Stopper is attached to the Document Eject Tray Extension, so you can adjust its position to suit the document length. When LTR/A4-size documents are loaded, close the Document Eject Tray Extension and raise the Document Eject Stopper. When A3-size documents are loaded, open the Document Eject Tray Extension and raise the Document Eject Stopper.

# **Document Feeding Methods**


Two document feeding methods are available: continuous feeding, which feeds documents automatically from the Document Feed Tray by the pickup roller; and manual feeding, which requires manually feeding one document at a time for transport by the feed roller, while the pickup roller is disabled.

# **Selecting the Document Feeding Method**

Continuous Feeding is the default feeding method. However, for the one-by-one page feeding, manual feeding can be enabled by selecting [Manual Feeding] as the [Feeding Option] in the ISIS/TWAIN driver, or [Separation Off] with the User Mode. Continuous manual feeding is also provided as way to scan a batch of document pages that cannot be automatically fed.

# **Continuous Feeding**

With Continuous Feeding, documents loaded in the Document Feed Tray are picked up automatically by the pickup roller and transported by the feed roller, while the retard roller separates each page to avoid double feeding



## **Manual Feeding**

The Document Feed Tray is raised so that documents can be fed manually one sheet at a time.

For manual feeding, you need to insert each document page far enough to be pulled in by the feed roller (because the pickup roller is disabled).



# IMPORTANT


- Because pages are not separated by the retard roller during manual feeding, a paper jam will occur if multiple pages are fed together.
- To scan bound multi-page documents such as invoice booklets, place the bound edge against the feed inlet and scan using manual feeding.

# Hint

- In the manual feed mode, the Si icon is displayed on the display panel.
- The User Mode's [Separation Off] setting corresponds to the [Manual Feeding] Feeding Option setting in the ISIS/TWAIN driver. Enabling the [Separation Off] with User Mode or selecting the [Manual Feeding] feeding option causes the Document Feed Tray to rise.
- By assigning "Manual Feeding" to the Function key, it can be enabled and disabled by pressing the key. "Assigning a Function to the Function Key" (See p. 58)

# **Continuous manual feeding mode**

Enable the Continuous Manual Feeding Mode from the User Mode when document pages do not separate properly using Continuous Feeding.



# Hint

For the ordinary manual feeding are non-continuous, so that documents are placed beside the scanner to be picked up and handfed one page at a time. For the continuous manual feeding mode, a stack of documents is placed on the Document Feed Tray and handfed from there one page at a time, making operation easier.

The continuous manual feeding mode can be set with the scanner driver or by the selecting [Manual Feed] in User Mode.




Be sure to turn off the continuous manual feeding mode after scanning. Otherwise, normal Continuous Feeding will be disabled the next time someone uses the scanner.

### **Setting with the Scanner Driver**

By default, the continuous manual feeding mode have to be set by the scanner driver.



  - The continuous manual feed setting items are displayed.

the ordinary manual feeding mode is enabled.

# **Scanning Documents Larger than A3**

Folio Scan enables you to scan documents that are larger than A3 and therefore do not fit in the feeder. To use the function, fold the document in half lengthwise and place it into the feeder. The scanner will scan both sides and combine the scanned images into a single image.


- 1 Open the scanner driver's setting screen. (See p. 76)
- Set [Page Size] on the [Basic] tab to a size that is half that of the paper to be actually scanned, and set [Scanning Side] to [Folio]. For example, when scanning a document of A2 size folded, set [Page Size] to [A3].



# **IMPORTANT**

When [Scanning Side] is set to [Folio], [Detect by Ultrasonic] in the [Error Detection] tab sheet – [Double Feed Detection] is automatically turned off.

Set [Feeding Option] on the [Feeding] tab to [Manual Feeding]. (See p. 44)




- 4 Click the [OK] button to close the settings screen.
- Fold the document in half.
  Crease the document firmly down its center to fold the document in half. Fold the document so that its edges are neatly aligned. If the document is not folded properly, paper jams may occur or distortions may appear in the combined scanned image.

# **!** IMPORTANT

A portion of the scanned image will be missing at the fold line.

6 Place the document with the folded edge facing right.



# **IMPORTANT**

Adjust the document guides to fit the width of the document. Otherwise, the image may scan as skewed or shifted.

- Pint
- The scanned image of the front side becomes the left half of the recombined image.
- The maximum size for combined images is A2. Use this method to scan A2-sized documents. When scanning a folded document of a size other than the standard formats, set [Page Size] on the scanner driver settings screen to [Match original size]. (See p. 80)

# **Scanning with Carrier Sheets**

To scan without damaging documents or contaminating the rollers and feed path with documents such as carbon paper, insert each document sheet into an optional carrier sheet before loading it in the scanner.


- Open the scanner driver's setting screen. (See p. 76)
- Open the [Feeding] tab, and set [Document type] to [Carrier sheet].




3 Click the [OK] button to close the settings screen.

4 Insert the document into the carrier sheet.

You can set up to three Carrier sheets at a time in the scanner.



5 Load the document with the sealed end of the carrier sheet as the leading edge.



After placing the document, align the document guides with both edges of the document.




#### CAUTION

If the document is not placed properly inside the carrier sheet, you may get a document jam or not get a scan image as intended

# IMPORTANT

• Insert documents straight into the center of the carrier sheet. Proper scanning will not be possible if the document is too close to either side, tilted, or protruding from the carrier sheet.



- The maximum thickness of documents that can be scanned in the carrier sheet is 127 g/m<sup>2</sup> (0.15 mm). Documents thicker than 127 g/m<sup>2</sup> may cause scanner malfunctions such as paper jams.
- Carrier sheet is a consumable item. Replace it with a new one when necessary, if there is visible damage or smudging.
- As a rough guide, replace the carrier sheet after 1,000 scanning operations with a single 80g/m<sup>2</sup> (22 lb bond) sheet inserted.

# **Long Document Scanning**


Setting the scanner to the Long Document Mode enables scanning documents up to 5,588 mm long (220") (or up to 3,000 mm (118.11") with the DR-G2090).

The Long Document Mode can be set with the scanner driver or by the selecting [Long Document] in User Mode.

## **Setting with the Scanner Driver**


By default, the Long Document Mode is set by the scanner driver.

- Open the scanner driver's setting screen. (See p. 76)
- In the [Basic] tab, click the [Setting] button of [Page Size] [Page Size Settings] dialog box will open.



### Click the [Long Document Mode] tab and specify the Long mode.

Depending on the length of the document, select [Long Document Mode (1000 mm)], [Long Document Mode (3000 mm)], or [Long Document Mode (5588 mm)].

- The [Long Document Mode (5588mm)] setting is not available in the DR-G2090.
- If you select the [Feed slowly] check box, documents are fed at a slow rate, regardless of resolution or mode settings.

Click the [OK] button to close the Settings screen.



Hint

When you set the Long mode, [(Long Document)] will be displayed in [Page Size] in the [Basic] tab.

## **Setting with User Mode**

The Long Document Mode can be set from User Mode. To make this setting in the User Mode, first allow it by the Canon imageFORMULA Driver Setting Tool. "Configuring Scanner Driver Settings" (See p. 62)

- Press the Menu key on the operation panel. User Mode is activated. "User Mode Operations" (See p. 60)
- 2 Press the ▲▼ keys to select [Scan Setting], and press IOK1. The scan setting items are displayed.
- Press the ▲▼ keys to select [Long Document], and press [OK].

The long document setting items are displayed.

Press the ▲▼ keys to select [Max Document Length], and press [OK].

Press the ▲▼ keys to specify the long document mode. According to the document length, select [Long Document (1000 mm)], [Long Document (3000 mm)], or [Long Document (5588 mm)].



The [Long Document (5588mm)] setting is not available in the DR-G2090.

- Press [OK] to accept.
- Press the Menu key to return to the original screen.
  - IMPORTANT
  - Scanning in Long Document Mode can slow down the processing speed.
  - When Long Document Mode is set to [Long Document (3000 mm)] or [Long Document (5588 mm)], the scanned image may be lost if the scanning mode is set to color and Image Quality is set to [Image quality priority]. In this case, scan the document in black and white or reduce the Image Quality setting.
  - When Long Document Mode is set to [Long Document (3000 mm)] or [Long Document (5588 mm)], the scanned image may be lost if scanning is performed at 400/600 dpi or the scanning mode is set to color and the scanning side setting is "Duplex". In this case, lower the resolution, scan the document in black and white or select the "Simplex" scanning side setting.

- If a sheet is loaded at a skewed angle when scanning long documents, it may be damaged by contacting both sides of the feed path. Be careful to place the document so that it is not skewed.
- Paper jam detection may react slowly when scanning long documents, which could result in damage to the jammed documents. Be especially careful to avoid paper jams.
- To scan long documents, enable the [Separation Off], and manually feed pages one by one. "Separation Off" (See p. 65)


# **Detecting a Document Double Feed**

This scanner includes a function to detect document double feeds. This function causes the scanner to automatically stop when it detects that multiple document sheets have been fed at the same time. You can also specify whether to save the scanned image after scanning has finished and continue scanning the document (double feed detection ignore function).

To use the double feed detection function, you must first open the scanner driver settings screen and enable double feed detection. It is also necessary to set [Rapid recovery system] to use the double feed detection ignore function.

# **Setting procedure**

- 1 Open the scanner driver's setting screen. (See p. 76)
- 2 Open the [Error Detection] tab.
- 3 Select either the [Detect by Length] or the [Detect by Ultrasonic] check box (or both).



To also use the double feed detection ignore function, open the [Others] tab, select the [Rapid recovery system] check box, and click the [Setting] button.

The [Rapid Recovery System Settings] dialog box opens.



Select [Show a continue dialog and stop scanning], and click the [OK] button.



Pint


If [Notify an error and continue scanning] is selected, feeding does not stop when double feeding is detected, but it is notified by the scanner's buzzer or LED.

- 6 Click the [OK] button to close the settings screen.
  - IMPORTANT
  - If documents like plastic cards are scanned, it may be falsely detected as a double feed.
  - Depending on the paper type and paper thickness, false detection of double feed may occur. If the double feed detection malfunctions, clear the [Detect by Ultrasonic] check box of the [Error Detection] tab.

# What to do when a double feed is detected

When not using the double feed detection ignore function

If a document double feed is detected during scanning, document feeding stops when the double fed documents are ejected. When this happens, the following error is displayed in the operation panel. "Error Message" (See p. 138)




Also, a message screen is displayed to notify you that a double feed has been detected.

#### When using the double feed detection ignore function

If a document double feed is detected during scanning, document feeding stops when the double fed documents are ejected. The following error is displayed in the operation panel.



Also, the [Rapid Recovery System] screen appears to enable you to specify whether to continue scanning.

# **Count the Number of Document** Sheets

This function counts the number of document sheets before scanning.

### **Count-Only Mode**

The number of loaded document sheets is counted by simply feeding them through the scanner.



The Count-Only Mode is executed from the operation panel, and can be used to count document sheets even when no computer is connected.

- Place the document.
- Press the Menu key on the operation panel. User Mode is activated. "User Mode Operations" (See p. 60)
- Press the ▲▼ keys to select [Count Only], and press [OK].

Count-Only Mode is enabled.



If "Count Only" is assigned to the Function key, press the Function key to enable Count-Only Mode. "Assigning a Function to the Function Key" (See p. 58)

Press the ▲▼ keys to select [Start], and press [OK]. Document counting starts.



#### Hint

To stop document feeding, press the Stop key.

## **Verify Scan**

The scanner compares the document page count obtained from the Count-Only Mode (or entered manually) with the actual count of document pages scanned, and an error message is displayed if the two counts do not match.

# **Separation Off**



The manual feeding mode is enabled and the sicon is displayed. The Document Feed Tray is raised so that documents can be fed manually one sheet at a time. "Manual Feeding" (See p. 44) If the scanner is already in the manual feeding mode, selecting [Separation Off] and then [OK] disables the manual feeding mode.

#### **New File**



Enables the File Separation function, and \( \mathbb{N} \) icon appears. When scanning documents in multiple batches, batch file separation occurs each time you load the next batch and resume scanning.

In order to use this function, [Panel] must first be selected for [Batch Separation] on the [Others] tab sheet in the scanner driver. Unless [Panel] is selected for [Batch Separation], separate batch files are not produced even when [New File] is selected.

When the File Separation function is enabled, selecting [New File] and pressing the OK key disables the File Separation function.

# **Scanner Setting**



Select the following menu items to configure scanner operation.

## Sleep

Selects the amount of time (120, 60 or 10 minutes) from when the scanner is last used to when it enters Sleep Mode.

#### **Auto Power Off**

Sets the Auto Power Off Function.

When set to [On], the Auto Power Off Function automatically turns off the power supply after four hours without scanning or other operation.

# **Display Contrast**

■ Adjusts the display panel contrast with the keys.

#### Buzzer

Configures the buzzer to sound when operation panel keys are pressed, and when errors occur. Select from the following menu settinas.

#### Volume

Select buzzer volume (low, medium, high).

#### **Timing**

Select buzzer timing. None: No buzzer sound.

**Error**: The buzzer sounds when a scanner error occurs.

**Operation & Error**: The buzzer sounds when a scanner error occurs and a operation panel key is pressed.

## **Key Repeat**

Sets the panel display method.

On: The panel display scrolls continuously while a key is pressed.

Off: The panel display scrolls each time a key is pressed.



There are two methods of double feed detection: comparing the length of documents, and detecting unevenness between documents by ultrasonic sensors, which can be set by the scanner driver, "When you want to detect multiple pages fed at the same time" (See p. 84)

## **Separation Force**

If double feeding or a paper jam occurs, consider changing the Separation Mode.

**High Separation Mode**: Use when high friction between fed sheets makes their separation difficult.

**Normal**: Use this setting normally.

Thin Paper Mode: Use when feeding fine documents.



#### CAUTION

In [High Separation Mode], the separation force can be strong enough to damage some documents. In that case, use the [Normal] or [Thin Paper Mode].

#### Manual Feed

Configures the continuous manual feeding mode. Select from the following menu settings.

#### On/Off

This mode disables automatic feeding by the Pickup Roller, so that the loaded document stack must be fed by hand onesheet at a time by the operator, "Continuous manual feeding mode" (See p. 45)

On: The Pickup Roller is disabled.

Off: Documents are fed by the Pickup Roller.

#### **Roller Rotating Time**

Set the time (0, 30, 60, 180, or 300 seconds) that the Feed Roller will continue to rotate after feeding in a stack of documents.

## **Staple Detection**

Set the Staple Detection sensitivity level.

High Sensitivity: High Staple Detection sensitivity.

Normal: Normal Staple Detection sensitivity.

Low Sensitivity: Low Staple Detection sensitivity.

## **Long Document**

Configures the Long Document Mode. Select from the following menu settings.

#### **Max Document Length**

Sets the maximum length of documents to be scanned. "Long Document Scanning" (See p. 50)

Long Document (5588 mm): Documents up to 5,588 mm long (220") are automatically detected for scanning.

Long Document (3000mm): Documents up to 3,000mm long (118.11") are automatically detected for scanning.

Long Document (1000mm): Documents up to 1,000mm long (39.37") are automatically detected for scanning.

Default (432 mm): Documents up to 432 mm long (17") can be scanned.



## Hint

- Feeding a document longer than the maximum automatically detectable pagelength causes a paper jam, and transport stops.
- The [Long Document (5588 mm)] setting is not available in the DR-G2090

#### Speed

Sets the document feeding speed in the Long Document Mode.

**Normal**: Documents are fed at normal speed. **Slow**: Documents are fed at low speed.

# **Tray position**

The Document Feed Tray should be set to fit the maximum number of document sheets to be loaded. "Preparing the Document Feed Tray" (See p. 36)

**500**: Up to 500 sheets **300**: Up to 300 sheets **100**: Up to 100 sheets



The [500] setting is not available in the DR-G2090.

#### **Feed Interval**

Sets the feed interval. Lengthening the paper feed interval can make it easier to keep ejected documents aligned. The default setting is "Interval 1 (short)".

Different feed intervals can be set depending on the model in use.

**DR-G2140**: Interval 1 (short), Interval 2, Interval 3, Interval 4, Interval 5, Interval 6, Interval 7 (long)

**DR-G2110**: Interval 1 (short), Interval 2, Interval 3, Interval 4, Interval 5, Interval 6 (long)

**DR-G2090**: Interval 1 (short), Interval 2, Interval 3, Interval 4, Interval 5 (long)

### **Dust Detection**

Sets whether to detect dust in the scanning unit.

- On (Message & Interrupt): When dust is detected in the scanning unit, a message is displayed on the scanner's display panel and scanning is interrupted.
- On (Message & Continue): When dust is detected in the scanning unit, a message is displayed on the scanner's display panel and scanning continues.

Off: Disables the Dust Detection function.







Selecting [Off] for [DHCP] moves to the setting screen for network information such as the IP address.

The LAN setting screens are displayed in the following order.



# IMPORTANT

- If the entered IP address is "0.0.0.0", "255.255.255.255", "127.xxx.xxx.xxx", or "169.254.xxx.xxx", a warning screen is displayed and the entry is rejected.
- If the entered subnet mask is not a contiguous left-justified value, a warning screen is displayed and the entry is rejected.
- If the entered default gateway is "0.0.0.0", "255.255.255.255", "127.xxx.xxx", "169.254.xxx.xxx", a warning screen is displayed and the entry is rejected.

# Pint

Network information can also be set in the Web menu. "Network Setting" (See p. 101)

## **Time-Out Setting**

Set the time (Off, 30 or 60 seconds) from displaying the Job screen to returning to the PC selection screen.

If no operation occurs before the time selected in this menu has elapsed, the screen returns to the PC selection screen.

# **Scanning Methods**

# **Selecting a Scan Job**

This scanner's scan methods include the "job function", which executes scanning by operation panel operation.

### **About the Job Function**

The job function selects and executes jobs (favorites) that have been registered with CaptureOnTouch by pressing the Job key on the operation panel.


Job registration stores scanning conditions such as image file format, save destination and image processing settings for each job to be used with the Job Function.

For details on registering jobs, see the help of CaptureOnTouch.

### **Executing Jobs (with USB connection)**

- Press the Job key on the operation panel.

  The jobs registered on the computer connected via USB are displayed.
- Press the ▲▼ keys to select the job.





# **Setting the Scanner Driver**

When you load the driver for the first time, the selected scanner and a dialog for selecting the default paper size are displayed.



- These settings will apply when [Default] is clicked in the ISIS driver dialog box.
- For the TWAIN driver, the default size will be set to A4 and this cannot be modified

To scan documents with an application such as CaptureOnTouch, open the scanner driver and configure the scanning conditions and other settings.

This section describes the configuration and functions of the scanner driver.


### **Configuration and Functions of the Scanner Driver**




Configure basic scanning conditions such as the mode, page size. resolution, and scanning side.



Depending on the ISIS compatible application, the application may have its own screen for setting scanning conditions. If the scanner driver is opened in such an application, setting items related to the functions provided by the scanner driver other than scanning conditions will be displayed on the [Basic] tab.



### [Brightness] tab









### [Error Detection] tab



Set the items to be detected as errors during the scan.

### [Others] tab




Configure special scan method and image processing settings.

### [Imprinter/Addon Dialog] tab



Configure add-ons for scanned images. Also, when the optional Imprinter Unit is attached to the scanner, configure imprinting.

#### **User's Guide**



Informs you about the settings changed automatically by the driver. In addition, displays the image for which settings were currently made, in the illustrations.

### **Setting Basic Scanning Conditions**

This section provides an overview of the basic setting items that are the minimum requirements when configuring the scanner settings.

# **Confirming Basic Conditions for Scanning**

When you scan a document, make sure you confirm the [Color mode], [Page Size], [Dots per inch], and [Scanning Side] basic conditions in the Basic settings dialog box.



#### Color mode

Select the scanning mode.



• [Advanced Text Enhancement] and [Advanced Text Enhancement II] remove or process the background color and background surrounding text to enhance the text for easy reading. When [Advanced Text Enhancement II] is selected, you can make the text in scanned images easier to read by adjusting the contrast on the [Brightness] tab.

- [Active Threshold] is intended for batch processing various kinds of documents at once, such as those with thin (light) text or stains. For example, you can batch process documents such as photocopies at once. Brightness-related properties are automatically adjusted based on the text and background of the whole image, enabling consistent reproduction of light characters and removal of background stains.
- [Detect automatically] detects whether the document is in color, grayscale, or black and white. You can configure advanced settings related to the detection method by clicking [Setting]. For details, see the Help.

### Page Size

Select the page size that matches the document to be scanned.



If [Match original size] is selected, the edges of the document are detected and images that match the size of the document are saved.

### Dots per inch

Select the scanning resolution.



- Higher resolutions provide clearer images but result in larger file sizes and slower scanning.
- When [Detect automatically] is specified, the resolution is detected automatically from the content printed in the document.

### **Scanning Side**

Select which of the sides of the document to scan.



If the scanning side is set to [Skip blank page], the images of blank pages are deleted when images are saved.

# **Scanning Documents of Unregistered Page Sizes**

You can register an unregistered paper of non-standard size with a name, as a custom paper size.

Click the [Setting] button of [Page Size] in the [Basic] tab, to display the [Page Size Settings] dialog box.

Register the paper of non-standard size in the [Custom Page Size] tab.




### **Specifying the Scan Area**

Configure the following settings when you want to specify the area of the document to be scanned.

### Specifying an area

To scan one area of a larger document, click [Setting] on [Page Size] in the [Basic] tab to display the [Page Size Settings] dialog box.

Designate which area of the document to scan in the [Scan Area] tab.



# **Configuring Scanner Settings According** to Purpose

Set the scanning conditions according to the scanning purpose.

# When you want to delete the images of the blank pages in two-sided documents

Set the scanning side setting to [Skip Blank Page] on the [Basic] tab to delete the images of the blank pages in the document.



If [Skip Blank Page] is selected, the [Setting] button is enabled, and you can adjust the level for judging whether pages are blank.



### When you want to enhance contours in images

Adjust the edge emphasis setting on the [Image control] tab.



### When you want to reduce the moire patterns that appear when color photos in magazines and other documents are scanned at low resolutions

Setting [Moire Reduction] on the [Image control] tab sheet allows you to reduce the moire patterns that are generated when color photos are scanned at low resolutions.





Moire reduction can be enabled when the resolution is 300 dpi or less, and [High Speed Moire Reduction] is displayed when the resolution is 240 dpi or less.

#### When you want to reduce the color unevenness

Check the check box of [Color unevenness reduction] on the [Image control] tab to reduce the color unevenness.



You can control the level of color unevenness by enabling the [Setting] button.



### To thicken lines and text in scanned images

Drag the [Character Emphasis] slider in the [Image processing] tab to make lines and text in the scanned images thicker or thinner.



# When you want to enhance text that is difficult to read because of factors such as the background of the scanned document

Select [Advanced Text Enhancement], [Advanced Text Enhancement II], or [Active Threshold] for the color mode setting on the [Basic] tab sheet. The background behind the text is removed or processed so that the text is emphasized for better readability.



- Advanced Text Enhancement is suitable for a document with a light background color or a document with a non-uniform background (such as a pattern). If the background is uniform, it is removed where it surrounds the text, and if the background is non-uniform, it is processed to enhance text readability.
- Advanced Text Enhancement II is suitable for scanning a document with a uniform background color and light text and background. If the background is non-uniform, such as a pattern, the background may not be able to be completely removed and the text may become difficult to read. If necessary, you can make the text in scanned images easier to read by adjusting the contrast on the [Brightness] tab.

 [Active Threshold] is intended for batch processing various kinds of documents at once, such as those with thin (light) text or stains. For example, you can batch process documents such as photocopies at once. Brightness-related properties are automatically adjusted based on the text and background of the whole image, enabling consistent reproduction of light characters and removal of background stains.

# When you want to detect multiple pages fed at the same time

Select the [Double Feed Detection] check box on the [Error Detection] tab. You can enable either one or both of [Detect by Ultrasonic] and [Detect by Length].



# When you want to match the orientation of images to the text when scanning a mixture of pages with different text orientations

Select [Text orientation recognition] in [Document Orientation] on the [Others] tab. The text orientation on each page is detected, and the scanned image is rotated in 90-degree increments to correct the orientation.



# When you want to rotate the images of a document placed horizontally to correct the orientation

Specify the rotation angle in [Document Orientation] on the [Others] tab.




### When you want to use batch separation for scanning

When you want to divide and scan a document, you can separate a batch at the timing with which each next document is placed and scanned.(Only enabled for applications that support batch separation.)In this case, set the scanner driver as follows.

• Set [Feeding Option] on the [Feeding] tab to [Panel-Feeding] or [Automatic Feeding].



• Set [Batch Separation] on the [Others] tab to [Auto].



When [Batch Separation] is set to [Auto], the batch is separated after the next document is placed and scanning is continued. For more details about [Blank Page] and [Patchcode], "More Advanced Scanning Methods (Batch Separation)" (See p. 92)

### When you want to use MultiStream settings for scanning

Multi-stream allows you to output multiple different scanned images with a single scan operation, and output scanned images with different scanning conditions for each of the front and back pages (MultiStream settings).

When you want to use the MultiStream settings for scanning, select the [Use MultiStream] checkbox on the [Others] tab to display the setting items related to MultiStream, and then configure the setting items in the following order.



- ① When you want to specify different scanning conditions for the front and back pages of a document, select [Both] for [Scanning Side] on the [Basic] tab in advance.
- ② Specify the number of scanning conditions to apply in [Stream count of Front]. Up to three can be specified.
- ③ Select [Front 1st], and then open the other tabs and set the scanning conditions. Depending on the value specified for [Stream count of Front], configure the remaining [Front 2nd] and [Front 3rd] in the same way.
- When specifying the scanning conditions of the back, configure the settings in the same way as described in ② to ③. In this case, specify [Stream count of Back], and then set the scanning conditions for each of [Back 1st] to [Back 3rd].

#### To scan barcodes

After installing the Barcode Module, you can scan barcodes on documents. Click the [Barcode] button on the [Others] tab to configure barcode scanning conditions.

# When you want to remove dots and notches that appear in documents

You can remove dots and notches protruding from object outlines that appear in documents from scanned images.



- Select the [Erase Dot] check box to automatically remove isolated black dots (3 x 3 dot size) from white backgrounds (or white dots from black backgrounds).
- Select the [Erase Notch] check box to remove notches that protrude from object outlines in scanned images.

### When you want to save a scanner driver setting

When you finish configuring a setting, click the [Save] button of [User Preference] to save the setting.



The saved setting is registered to the list. You can delete a setting from the list with the [Delete] button, and save or load a configuration file with the [Back Up] or [Restore] button.



# **More Advanced Scanning Methods (Batch Separation)**

### **Batch Separation (Insert blank page)**

Recognizes blank pages as batch separators and performs batch separation (automatic file separation) when documents containing blank pages are scanned.

On the [Others] tab of the ISIS driver properties, select [Blank Page] from the Batch Separation dropdown list.



### IMPORTANT

- When [Simplex] is selected in [Scanning Side], blank pages on the scanned side will be recognized as separators. When [Duplex]. [Skip blank page], or [Folio] is selected in [Scanning Side], document pages will be recognized as separators when both sides of a page are blank.
- Images of pages recognized as separators will not be saved.



For batch separation with Panel Feeding or Automatic Feeding, see "When you want to use batch separation for scanning" on p. 85.

# **Batch Separation Using Patch Code Sheets**

This scanner supports batch separation (automatic file separation) functions by using patchcodes.

By tucking patchcode sheets supplied with this scanner into a document and scanning it, the scanner can automatically separate files by images of documents containing patchcode sheets (or documents after the patchcode sheet).

### | Hint

Patchcodes are included with this product in PDF format. An application that can read PDF files is required to use this function.

The following patchcodes are installed together with the scanner driver as PDF files.

Type of Patchcode	Pattern	Description
PATCH T (FILE A)		Files are separated from the page after the page printed with this patchcode. You specify in the application whether to include the page printed with the patchcode in the scanned image.
PATCH II (FILE B)		Files are separated from the page printed with this patchcode. The page with the printed patchcode is always included in the scanned image.

The following operations are performed when using patchcodes for scanning.

### Print patchcode with a printer.

Click [Start] – [All Programs] – [Canon DR-G2000 Series] and then select [Patchcode] from the menu.

Patchcodes can be printed in A4 and letter (LTR) sizes. Open the application and print a patchcode that is the same size as the document to be scanned.








### IMPORTANT

- Patchcodes must be printed in their normal size. If patchcodes are enlarged or reduced, they may not be recognized correctly.
- When copying provided patchcodes to create different sized patchcodes, ensure that the patchcode fits inside the effective range shown in the following diagram. Also, when copying patchcodes, ensure that they are the same size and shade as the original.



 Keep the patchcode sheet clean. Take particular care to keep the patchcode detection range area clean. Also, do not bend, fold or crease the sheet. Place the documents in the scanner after inserting the patchcode sheet in front of the page that separates the files.



**IMPORTANT** 

Because patchcodes can only be detected on the front side, load the documents with the patchcode side up.

Open the scanner driver settings screen and select [Patchcode] in [Batch Separation] on the [Others] tab.

You can output or delete the log file.

### [Network monitor] tab

# **Maintenance**

# **Daily Maintenance**

Clean the scanner on a regular basis, as described below, to maintain peak scanning quality.



#### CAUTION

- When cleaning the scanner and the inside of the scanner, turn OFF the power switch and disconnect the power cord from the power outlet
- Do not use spray cleaners to clean the scanner. Precision mechanisms, such as the light source, may get wet, and cause a malfunction
- Never use paint thinner, alcohol, or other organic solvents to clean the scanner. The exterior of the scanner may become deformed, discolored, or melted. It may also cause a fire or electric shock.
- When opening and closing the upper unit, be careful not to get your fingers caught, as this may result in personal injury.

### **Cleaning the Scanner**

### **About the Cleaning Cloth**

Use the cleaning cloth supplied with the scanner to clean its interior.

### **Cleaning the Scanner Exterior**

To clean the outside of the scanner, wipe off any dirt with a cloth that has been dampened with water and thoroughly wrung out, and then wipe the scanner dry with a clean dry cloth.




### **Cleaning the Document Feed Inlet and Transport Path**

Dust or paper particles in the document feed inlet or inside the scanner can cause spots to appear on scanned images. Use compressed air to periodically clean dust and paper particles from the inlet and the inside of the scanner. After completing large scanning jobs, turn OFF the scanner and clean out any paper particles.


### **Cleaning the paper detection sensor**

Dust and debris that collect on the sensors may cause documents to be recognized incorrectly. Clean the sensors periodically using a blower, etc. so that dust and debris do not collect on them.

When cleaning the inside of the scanner, make sure to open and close the upper unit using the following procedure.



When opening and closing the upper unit, be careful not to get your fingers caught, as this may result in personal injury.



# Cleaning the Scanning Glass, Roller, and Pad

If streaks or dirt appear in scanned images, the scanning glass, rollers or separation pad in the scanner may be dirty. Clean them periodically.

IMPORTANT

Scratches on the sensor glass may cause marks on the images, as well as feeding errors. If you find a scratch on the scanning glass,

contact your local authorized Canon dealer or service representative to have the glass replaced.


- Turn the power switch off, and disconnect the power plug from the power outlet.
- Close the Document Eject Tray Extension if it is open.
- 3 Open the upper unit smoothly. (See p. 106)
- Wipe any dust off the scanning glass with a cleaning cloth or a clean, dry cloth.

Make sure that you clean both scanning glasses, the one on the upper unit and the one on the main unit.




### CAUTION

Do not spray water or neutral detergent directly on the scanner. Precision mechanisms, such as the light source, may get wet, and cause a malfunction.



Wipe the rollers using a moistened and firmly wrung- out cloth while rotating the rollers.




- 6 Remove the pickup roller, feed roller, retard roller, and retard roller cover. (See p. 113)
  - IMPORTANT

Remove the pickup roller, feed roller, and retard roller before wiping away the dirt. The pad is mounted to the retard roller cover. Wipe away the dirt from the pad once the retard roller cover has been removed from the scanner.

Wipe the rollers that you removed using a moistened and firmly wrung-out cloth.



Wipe away the dirt from the pad mounted to the retard roller cover while removed using a cloth that has been dipped in water and thoroughly wrung.



## **!** IMPORTANT

When wiping the pad, do not apply excessive force. If you push too hard, the separation pad may peel off.



- **9** Reattach the retard roller and feeding roller. (See p. 113)
- 10 Smoothly close the upper unit. (See p. 107)
  - **IMPORTANT**

If paper jams or double feeds still occur frequently even after cleaning the rollers, roller replacement may be necessary. Contact your service representatives or Canon dealers.

## **Adjusting the Compression**

If the roller mounted inside the scanner is worn, the scan images may become slightly elongated vertically. In such cases, using the [Reduction ratio adjustment] function may reduce the stretching. The reduction ratio adjustment can be made with the Canon imageFORMULA Driver Setting Tool.

"About the Canon imageFORMULA Driver Setting Tool" (See p. 96)

#### **Auto Power OFF Function**

An auto power OFF function is built into the device. When the auto power OFF function is ON, the power supply automatically turns OFF after four hours have elapsed without a scan or other operation with the scanner.

The auto power OFF function can be set from the User Mode or with the Canon imageFORMULA Driver Setting Tool. "User Mode Operations" (See p. 60)

## **Power Plug**

If you leave the power plug connected to the power outlet for a long period of time, dust may accumulate at the power outlet, and cause a fire or electrical shock. Clean them periodically.

## **Replacing the Feed Roller**

As the rollers start to wear out, feeding quality declines, and document feed errors, such as paper jams, become more likely. If document feed errors continue to occur after cleaning the rollers, purchase the Roller Replacement Kit and replace the transport rollers (pickup, feed, and retard rollers).

## **Roller Replacement Cycle**

The feeding rollers are consumables. We recommend replacing them after every 600,000 pages fed.

When the rollers have fed more than 600,000 pages, a roller replacement message appears on the display panel whenever the scanner is turned ON. When the scanner is configured to reboot with the computer, a roller replacement message also appears on the computer screen.



## IMPORTANT


- When the roller replacement message appears, purchase the Roller Replacement Kit and replace the rollers by following the relevant steps in the following sections. All three rollers should be replaced at the same time.
- Pickup Roller (See p. 113)
- Feed Roller (See p. 115)
- Retard Roller (See p. 117)
- When the rollers start to wear out, problems such as paper jams and improper document feeding become more likely to occur. If this happens, replace the rollers, regardless of the page count of the roller usage counter.
- The messages displayed on the panel are cleared by resetting the roller counter. However, the messages will continue to be displayed each time the scanner is turned ON until the roller counter is reset.
- Make sure to reset the roller counter after replacing the rollers.

- In User Mode, [Maintenance] [Total Scan] shows the total number of pages fed over the life of the scanner, and cannot be reset.
- Press the Menu key on the operation panel.
  User Mode is activated. "User Mode Operations" (See p. 60)

The maintenance setting items are displayed.

When the optional imprinter is used, printing will become faint or nonexistent when the ink is depleted. It is recommended to keep a spare ink cartridge available.

## **Cleaning the Imprinter**


### **Cleaning the Guide Plate**

Ink that collects on the guide plate inside the optional imprinter may stain the documents when they are scanned. Clean off the ink with water and a mild detergent on a soft cloth that has been firmly wrungout, and then thoroughly dry it with a dry cloth.



### **Cleaning the Ink Cartridges**


If the imprinter print head nozzles are dirty, printing may become streaked or spotty. To prevent this, periodically remove the ink cartridge and clean the print head with a soft, dry cloth or cotton swab.

#### CAUTION

Do not touch the metal contacts on the ink cartridge. Doing so may cause poor connections, resulting in poor print quality.



## **Imprinter Testing**

After replacing an ink cartridge or cleaning the print head, perform a test print to confirm proper printing. Test printing is performed by the [Imprint Test] User Mode selection.




#### IMPORTANT

Before performing an Imprinter Test, load a sheet of paper into the Document Feed Tray.

### **Performing an Imprinter Test**

Use the following procedure to execute the Imprinter Test.

Load a sheet of paper into the Document Feed Tray for test printing.



Press the Menu key on the operation panel.

User Mode is activated. "User Mode Operations" (See p. 60)

- Press the ▲▼ keys to select [Imprint Test], and press [OK].
  - The imprinter test settings are displayed.
- Press the ▲▼ keys to select [Start], and press [OK]. Test printing of the installed imprinter is executed.
  - **!** IMPORTANT

If no paper is loaded for test printing, the imprinter test finishes without printing.

**5** Press the Menu key to return to the original screen.

## **Head Cleaning**

If lines or streaks appear in the imprinter printout, the printhead nozzle may be clogged. This can be corrected by performing head cleaning.

- **IMPORTANT**
- After head cleaning, run the imprinter test to check printing. (See p. 127)
- If head cleaning does not improve printing, remove the printhead and clean the ink cartridge. (See p. 126)

### **Head Cleaning**

- Press the Menu key on the operation panel.
  User Mode is activated. "User Mode Operations" (See p. 60)
- Press the ▲▼ keys to select [Imprint Test], and press [OK].
  - The imprinter test settings are displayed.
- Press the ▲▼ keys to select [Head Cleaning], and press [OK].
- Press the ▲▼ keys to select [Start], and press [OK]. Head cleaning executes and finishes.
- Press the Menu key to return to the original screen.

## **Troubleshooting**

## **Common Problems and Solutions**

This section provides recommended solutions to common problems. If you have a problem that is not solved by the following, contact your local authorized Canon dealer.

#### Problem 1 The scanner will not turn on.

#### Solutions

- (1) Confirm that the power cord is properly connected.
- Confirm that the power plug is plugged into a power outlet.

#### Problem 2 The scanner is not recognized.

#### Solutions

#### When connecting via USB:

- Confirm that the scanner is properly connected to the computer with a USB cable.
- (2) Confirm that the scanner is turned on. See the previous problem (1) if the scanner does not turn on.
- (3) The computer's USB interface may not support the scanner. The scanner cannot be guaranteed to work with all USB interfaces.
- (4) Confirm that the supplied USB cable is used to connect the scanner to the computer. The scanner cannot be guaranteed to work with all available USB cables.
- (5) If the scanner is connected to the computer via a USB hub, try removing the hub and connecting directly to the computer.
- (6) USB connection is not recognized when connected via LAN. Disconnect the LAN cable, restart the computer, and reconnect the USB cable.

#### When connecting via wired LAN:

- (1) Check the LAN cable connection.
- (2) The specified IP address may already be in use by another device. Contact your network's system administrator to change the IP address.
- (3) The specified device name may already be in use by another device. Contact your network's system administrator to change the device name. Be careful not to duplicate the device name when more than one scanner is installed.
- (4) LAN connection is not recognized when connected via USB. Disconnect the USB cable, restart the computer, and reconnect the LAN cable.

## Problem 3 Documents feed askew (scanned images are slanted).

#### Solutions

- Align the document guides to fit the documents as closely as possible, and load the documents so that they feed straightly.
- (2) Open the Document Feeder Tray Extension and load the documents.
- (3) Enable [Automatically straightens skewed] in the scanner driver settings.
- (4) If many pages have been scanned since roller cleaning, clean the rollers. If documents still feed askew, roller replacement or other maintenance may be needed. See "Maintenance" on p. 105 for roller replacement procedures.

## Problem 4 Documents are not scanned according to the settings configured in the scanner driver.

Solutions When you scan using [Select document] panel registered with CaptureOnTouch, the CaptureOnTouch settings have priority over the scanner driver settings. Edit settings in the [Select document] panel, or create a new [Select document] panel using the desired scanning conditions.

#### Problem 5 If white lines or streaks appear in scanned images.

Solutions Clean the scanning glass (both sides) and the feed and retard rollers. If a sticky substance such as glue or correction fluid is found, carefully wipe with just enough pressure to clean the area where the lines appear. If the problem cannot be solved by cleaning, the internal glass may be scratched. Contact your local authorized Canon dealer.

#### Problem 6 Scanned images are too dark (or light).

Solutions The brightness setting may need adjustment. Adjust the [Brightness] setting on the [Brightness] tab sheet of the scanner driver: higher if the images are too dark, and lower if too light.

## Problem 7 Text or images bleed through from the back side of documents to appear in scanned images.

Solutions (1) Increase the [Brightness] setting on the scanner driver's [Brightness] tab sheet. Alternatively, enable the "Prevent Bleed Through/Remove Background"

(2) If the paper is very thin, photocopy the original and scan the copy.

#### Problem 8 Duplex (two-sided) scanning is not possible.

setting.

Solutions

Solutions

Duplex scanning is not possible if the Scanning Side setting is set to [Simplex]. On the scanner driver's [Basic] tab sheet, set [Scanning Side] to [Duplex]. If Scanning Side is set to [Skip blank page], images of blank pages are not saved.

## Problem 9 A black margin appears around scanned document images.

A black margin appears when a document smaller than the preset papersize is scanned, or when the loaded document has shifted out of position. Make the following scanner driver settings.

- On the [Basic] tab sheet, set the [Page Size] to [Match original size].
- (2) Adjust the margin setting in the minus direction ([Basic tab] – [Page Size] – [Page Size Settings] – [Scan Area] tab)
- (3) Enable [Border Removal] ([Image processing] tab [Border Removal])

## Problem 10 The scanned image is abnormal for certain documents.

#### Solutions

A detection function such as border removal is enabled when scanning documents that include text or photos that extend to the edge of the page, preventing proper edge detection. When a page has text or photos extending to its edges, turn off the detection functions or scan that page individually.

## Problem 11 The scanned image is abnormal in a particular application.

#### Solutions

Some applications do not support functions such as auto-detection of page size, so scanning with such applications can produce abnormal scanned images. If abnormal image appearance seems to be application-dependent, try scanning with auto-detection disabled.

#### Problem 12 Pages are missing.

#### Solutions

When the scanner driver's [Scanning Side] setting is [Skip Blank Page], documents with very little black may be unintentionally skipped. Decrease the Set the likelihood of skipping blank page value ("When you want to delete the images of the blank pages in two-sided documents" (See p. 82)) or set the [Scanning Side] to another mode, such as simplex or duplex. If pages are skipped due to the document double feeding, see "Problem 7 Documents jam (or double-feed)."

#### Problem 13 Documents are collectively fed

#### Solutions

Click the [Advanced setting] button on the scanner driver's [Feeding] tab sheet, and check the [Increase separation force] checkbox in the [Advanced feed setting] dialog box. When setting in the User Mode, set [Separation Force] to [High Separation Mode]. "User Mode Operations" (See p. 60)
Also, make sure that the roller is installed correctly.

### Problem 14 The scanner will multifeed documents.

#### Solutions

- (1) Check that the roller is installed correctly. Clean the roller if necessary.
- (2) The document will not scan correctly if it is stuck due to static electricity or for any other reason. Fan the document before placing it.

#### Problem 15 Paper jam occurs.

#### Solutions

- (1) Check that the roller is installed correctly.
- (2) If paper jams occur repeatedly, open the settings window of the scanner driver, and select [Extra-thin paper] for [Document type] in the [Feeding] tab. Alternatively, reduce the number of inputted documents to around 10.
- (3) If a paper jam occurs due to the curling of the ends of the document after replacing or cleaning the roller, perform 5 single scans of an A4-sized document.

## Problem 16 Scanner does not feed document (or document has stopped in the feeding path).

Solutions

- (1) If the continuous manual feeding mode is enabled, documents may not feed correctly. Disable the continuous manual feeding mode. "Continuous manual feeding mode" (See p. 45)
- (2) Check that the roller is installed correctly. Clean the roller if necessary.

## Problem 17 Multiple pages of scanned images cannot be saved to a single file.

Solutions

Depending on the file format, multiple scanned image pages cannot be saved as a single file with CaptureOnTouch.

File type	Processing for multiple pages
BMP, JPEG	Scanned images are always saved one page per file.
PPTX	Multi-page images are always saved to a single file.
TIFF, PDF	You can save multiple pages to a single file by clicking and selecting [Create 1 file for pages of a document] in the displayed dialog box.

# Problem 18 All of the placed documents have been scanned, but the scanned image does not appear on the application.

Solutions

When [Panel-Feeding] or [Automatic Feeding] is selected as the feeding method on the scanner driver's Detail Settings screen, a scanning operation will not continue after all of the documents are fed, as the scanner awaits additional documents to be fed. Pressing the Stop key on the operation panel terminates the scanning operation.

#### Problem 19 Memory becomes insufficient and scanning stops.

Solutions

If you configure scanning conditions that use a large amount of the computer's memory, scanning may stop because of insufficient memory. Although this depends on the computer's memory size, the possibility of insufficient memory increases if any of the following scanning conditions overlap.

- [Color Mode] is set to [24-bit Color]
- A large page size is specified as the [Page Size].
   Alternatively, the page size is set to [Scanner's Maximum].
- A high resolution (600dpi etc.) is specified for [Dots per inch].

If an error message appears due to insufficient memory while scanning is in progress, exit the application, change the scanning conditions (e.g. reduce the resolution or page size) and then try scanning again. In addition, the amount of memory used can be contained by turning off [Moire Reduction] and [Prevent Bleed Through/Remove Background] if they are set to on.

#### Problem 20 Multifeeding when scanning multiple bound pages.

Solutions Place the bound edge against the feed inlet and scan by manual feeding.

#### Problem 21 Barcode detection fails.

Solutions Barcode detection may fail depending on the brightness of the image. Adjust the [Brightness] setting on the [Brightness] tab sheet of the scanner driver's setting screen. Alternatively, enable [Prevent Bleed Through / Remove Background] on the [Image control] tab sheet. Alternatively, increase the [Dots per inch] setting on the [Basic] tab sheet.

#### Problem 22 Ejected documents are misaligned.

Solutions

- Raise the Document Eject Stopper to stop ejected documents from spilling. (See p. 43)
- (2) Lengthening the paper feed interval can make it easier to keep ejected documents aligned. Open the scanner driver's settings screen, and on the [Feeding] tab sheet, click the [Advanced setting] button and increase the [Feed interval setting]. (See p. 26)

To set from User Mode, increase the [Feed Interval]. "User Mode Operations" (See p. 60)

(3) Depending on document thickness and condition, extra time may be needed for documents to fall into the eject tray, causing them to be pushed out by subsequent ejected documents. In this case, open the scanner driver's settings screen and on the [Feeding] tab sheet, select [Extra-thin paper] for the [Document type].
To set from User Mode, set [Separation Force] to

[Thin Paper Mode].

"User Mode Operations" (See p. 60)

## **Software Troubleshooting**

This section describes troubleshooting problems and solutions for operating the supplied software (CaptureOnTouch).

#### If scanning is too slow

- (1) Close other running programs, if any.
- (2) Scanning can be slowed down by memory shortage caused by memory-resident applications such as anti-virus programs. Close such memory-resident programs if necessary to free up memory space.
- (3) When insufficient hard disk space is available, the scanner may be unable to create the necessary temporary files for scanned data. Delete unneeded data on the hard disk to free up more space.
- (4) Scanning is slow, if the computer's USB port is not compliant with high-speed standards such as Hi-Speed USB2.0 and USB3.1 Gen1.
- (5) If using a common USB cable that is not USB3.1 Gen1 compliant, replace the cable with the supplied compliant cable.
- (6) When the scanner is connected to the computer via a USB hub that is not USB3.1 Gen1 compliant, remove the hub and connect the scanner directly to the computer.

#### If scanned image files cannot be opened in an application

- Scanned images saved as multi-page TIFF files can be opened only by programs that support this file format.
- (2) Images saved as compressed TIFF files (single- as well as multipage) can only be opened by programs that support the compressed format. This happens when using applications that do not support CaptureOnTouch's TIFF file compression. In this case, select "None" as the image file compression format before scanning.

There is a display glitch on the UI screen of CaptureOnTouch. Depending on the computer that you are using, a display glitch may occur on the UI screen when there are too many Scan mode panels, Select output panels, or Scanning Shortcut panels. Delete any panel that you will not use.

## **Useful tips**

Here are some useful tips for scanning documents with CaptureOnTouch.

## Where are scanned images saved? Can the save destination be changed?

Images are saved to the following locations, according to program settings.

Both Standard Scanning and Scanning Shortcut save the output to the destination set in the [Select output] panel.

All destination locations can be changed to other folders.

#### How are the scan settings configured?

By clicking the Edit button ( $[\@oline{>}\]$ ) in the [Select document] panel, you can edit the scan settings when the [Select document edit screen] opens.

## How do I save multiple pages in one file, or save one file per page?

When scanned images are saved in BMP or JPEG format, each image is always saved in a separate file.

When scanned images are saved in PDF or TIFF format, you can specify multi- or single-page files. See also "Problem 18" in "Common Problems and Solutions".

#### Can I copy or back up scanner setting configurations?

The setting configurations can be backed up and restored using [Back Up/Restore] on the [Basic settings] tab on the [Environmental settings] dialog box

#### How do I scan half-folded documents (folio scanning)?

Fold the document in half, and set it in the scanner with the fold at the right. Specify half-size document (the size after folding) and then scan. For details, see p. 47.

How can I skip blank pages, and scan only non-blank pages? Specify [Skip Blank Page] on the scanner driver setting screen, then scan.

#### How do I load and scan documents with mixed sizes?

Set [Page Size] to [Match original size] on the scanner driver setting screen, then scan. For details, see p. 80.

#### What is the best way to scan business cards or photos?

Set [Page Size] to [Match original size] on the scanner driver setting screen, then scan. Alternatively, register the size of the cards or photos to be scanned. For details, see p. 80.

#### How do I print scanned data?

- For both Standard Scanning and Scanning Shortcut, select [Print] in the [Select output] panel.
- To use this function, you need to install a plug-in.
- The plug-in can be installed by selecting its checkbox when installing CaptureOnTouch.

#### I want to save to other folders

- In CaptureOnTouch, destinations other than [Save to folder] are provided as a plug-in.
- By installing the plug-in, the scanned image can be printed, attached in an e-mail, or shared using various cloud services.
- The plug-in can be installed by selecting its checkbox when installing CaptureOnTouch.
- The available output destinations vary depending on the installed plug-in.

#### How can I attach scanned data to an e-mail (or send it as e-mail)?

- For both Standard Scanning and Scanning Shortcut, select [Attach to E-mail] in the [Select output] panel.
- To use this function, you need to install a plug-in.
- The plug-in can be installed by selecting its checkbox when installing CaptureOnTouch.

## Paper Jam, Skew and Staple Detection Processing

When a paper jam, skew, or staple is detected, any documents remaining in the Eject Tray and scanner must be removed.

#### CAUTION

- Be careful removing any documents remaining inside the scanner. Otherwise, documents could be damaged or unexpected injury from paper cuts may occur.
- Remove all documents remaining inside the scanner. Any torn paper remaining inside may cause paper jams or breakdowns.
- Remove any documents that have been left in the Eject Tray.
- Open the upper unit smoothly. (See p. 106)



#### CAUTION

When opening and closing the upper unit, be careful not to get your fingers caught, as this may result in personal injury.

- If any documents remain inside the scanner, remove them.
  - IMPORTANT
  - With the upper unit slightly opened, remove any document that is partially ejected on the Eject Tray.
  - Open the upper unit to the point where it stops, and remove the document remaining inside the scanner.

- Smoothly close the upper unit. Further, press both ends of the upper unit to verify that it is securely closed. (See p. 107)
- Check the last saved image, and try scanning again. Return the document removed from inside the scanner to the top of the stack in the input tray, and press the Start key to resume scanning.
  - IMPORTANT
  - Scanned images may not be saved even for documents ejected onto the Eject Tray. Be sure to check the last scanned image saved before scanning again.
  - If a skewed document was detected, reload it straightly and scan again.
  - If a staple was detected, remove the staple, reload the document, and scan again.


